

Eighteen Frogs, Team's Nucleus, Receive Orders

FORT WORTH, Texas, June 11 (AP).—Texas Christian University's football prospects received a terrific blow Friday when it was announced that eighteen members of the squad would report July 1 to North Texas Agricultural College as reservists.

Dean E. E. Davis of the Arlington college said his school had a Navy contract and was prepared to take care of the 176 Marines included in the call.

There was no official notice from the Marine Corps but the notices came by mail to the boys individually.

Included in the eighteen football players receiving notices were John Bond, Don Ezell, Van Hall, Bob McCollum, J. C. Oneal and Jim Woodfin, who were on last fall's varsity team. Other footballers ordered to Arlington were John Paul Admire, Weldon Bertrand Edwards, Billie Hearne, Emmett Talmadge Hill, Donald Hughes, John Burgess Smith, John Steele, J. P. Sout, Derrell Conway Tipps, Sam Hardin Weatherford, Keith Curry and James Gibson.

It is not known whether the men are to be kept at NTAC or not.

Only Clyde Flowers, tackle and captain of the 1943 team, can be counted on as a certain candidate for the TCU team. Flowers has been deferred because of an eye injury.
